Our Journey to Sinai is the story of a visit to Saint Catherine's monastery on the Sinai peninsula by a group of British scholars in the 1890's. Fortress-walled Saint Catherine's has been a pilgrimage site since its founding by the Byzantine Emperor Justinian in the 6th century. The British scholars were drawn there in quest of manuscripts from early Christian times. Their trip is vividly described by Agnes Bensly--bustling Cairo; a tent and camel crossing of the desert with Bedouin guides; the monks and monastery life; a breathtaking climb up 3000 stone steps to the top of Mount Sinai, and the biblical treasures they discovered in the monastery.*
